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PLACE TO STAY**

8 Holland Street Townhouse sits just above – and beside – 8 Holland Street Gallery in Bath town centre. Over its 3 ½ floors of original Georgian architecture, you'll find expertly-curated furniture, original artwork and textiles, and contemporary design elements.

The collection is always evolving, making each stay a little bit different. There's art from Alexander Calder, Elizabeth Frink and Zach Zono, and design features from Alberto Rosselini, Josef Frank and Vivai del Sud.



8 HOLLAND STREET

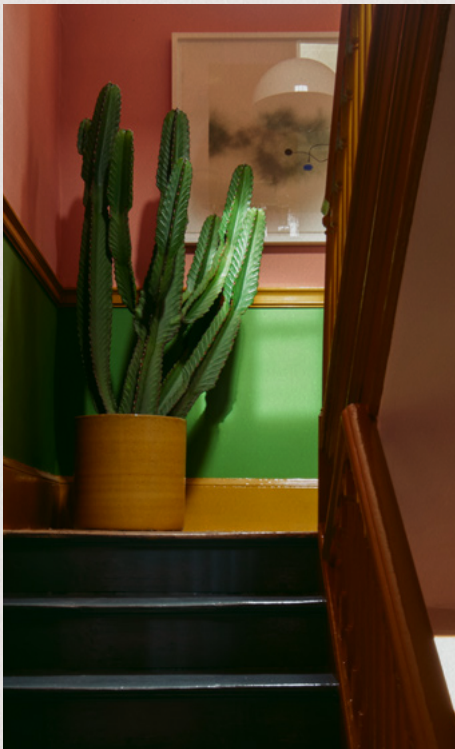
Founded by Tobias Vernon, 8 Holland Street is a gallery space and design studio with bespoke services in art sourcing and curation, furniture sourcing, and interior design.

Pop in and browse the carefully selected twentieth-century British artwork, European vintage furniture and studio pottery, Scandinavian and Moroccan textiles, objects from across the globe, contemporary design, and inspirational reference books.



LIVING SPACES

As you step into the Townhouse, you'll notice the hallway's original regency plasterwork, leading you to the staircase's Verner Panton flowerpot lights. Upstairs, the Venetian tripartite window guides daylight to the drawing room's Bamboli sofa, Turkish felt rugs and collected studio pottery. In the evening, the Plain English kitchen provides the perfect place to cook up a classic, or take inspiration from the Townhouse and create an eclectic mix of refined tastes.



BEDROOMS

Choose from three bedrooms of curated comfort. The principal bedroom suite features a Guillerme et Chambron bed and Cristal Art mirror in the en-suite powder room. The mustard twin's twists on nature include Angelic Voysey wallpaper and Italian bamboo beds by Bonanica. The guest bedroom homages Dickens' visits to Bath with its vintage writer's bureau.



BATH

Start the day with an artisan coffee at Colonna and Smalls or Cafe on the Barge. See the city from afar with the Bath skyline walk, or up close from the canal path. Pick up a piece of local creativity from Toppings & Co Books or Beaux Arts Gallery. And end the day with a seasonal meal and old world wine at Circus restaurant, and ice cream from Swoon gelato bar.

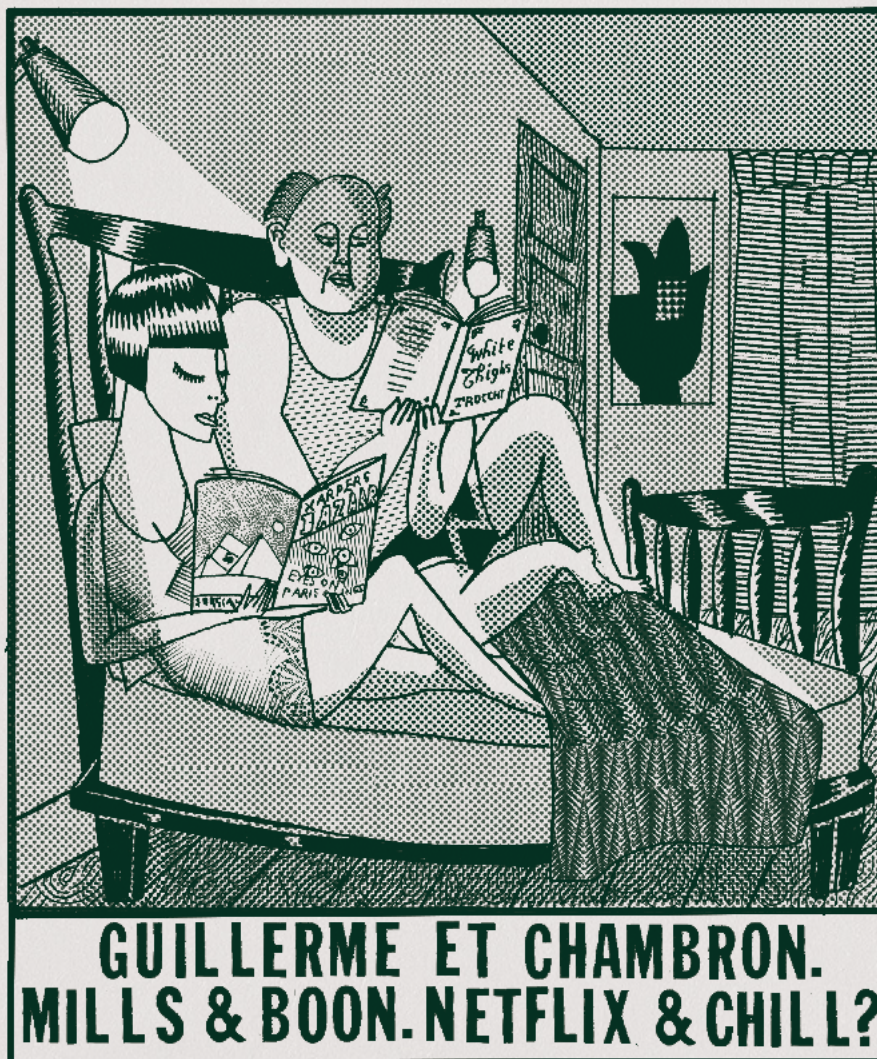
